The planned program should culminate in a degree and/or a certificate.

The successful applicant must:

- a) live within the Town of Glenville, including Scotia and Alplaus.
- b) be able to describe how they will benefit from the planned course of study
- c) anticipate where they might work after completing the program
- d) Write a letter or essay about yourself including the requirements above and your contributions to family and the community. Give information about your future plans and goals and how this scholarship will assist you in making further contributions to society.
- e) exemplify the ideals of the Rotary's motto: "Service Above Self."

This award seeks to recognize the applicant's contributions to family, peers, and the greater community. The award also recognizes achievements in clubs and/or organizations. The "Glenville Rotary Scholarship Committee" hopes to determine the potential of the applicant to make additional contributions to our society or through their increasing advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through world fellowship.

Qualifications:

- 1. Resident of the Town of Glenville, including Villages of Scotia and Alplaus and some areas within the Burnt Hills zip code.
- 2. Applicant's will attend either a two-year college or an accredited institution of higher learning or a technical trade school leading to a Certificate.
- 3. Community service activities will illustrate an active commitment to volunteerism or international awareness.
- 4. The applicant will have a background which reflects a commitment to his or her desired field of study.
- 5. There are no age or prior academic requirements.
- 6. Two letters of recommendation from someone familiar with your background.
- 7. Applicant may be self-nominated.
